points of interest

- > **Weir Pool** permits powered and non powered boating activities and is the perfect location for swimming, walking, cycling and bird watching.
- > Redda's Park is located on the foreshore of the Brim Weir Pool and is home to the camping ground facilities including amenities, playground, BBQ, shelters, tables and seating.
- > Netting Fence is located 9kms north of Brim on the Henty Highway and was erected in 1885. The vermin proof fence was constructed mainly on the 36th parallel from Tyntynder on the Murray River to the S.A. border, via Birchip and Lake Hindmarsh. The purpose being to stop rabbits invading the Mallee from the south and to keep the dingoes to the north. The fence is also the division between the Wimmera and Mallee regions.
- > Recreation Reserve is home to the Brim Sports Centre, football, netball, tennis and cricket. The Sports Centre can be hired for events and conferences.
- > Golf Country Club is located adjacent to the Recreation Reserve and features 9 holes and sand scrapes. The course is open from April to September. Visitors welcome.
- > **Bowls Brim Memorial Bowls Club** is open from September to April. Visitors welcome.
