- 31. Anzac Park Scott Street. Sporting centre of Warracknabeal. Football, cricket, netball, tennis and swimming.
- 32. Warracknabeal Golf Club Henty Highway (3kms north). 18 hole, sand belt course with first class greens and lush watered fairways. Ph 03 5398 2035
- 15. Lions Fauna Park and Picnic area Craig Avenue. Free electric BBQ's, picnic tables, rotunda, children's adventure playground and collection of native birds and animals.

A striking feature of the creek is the largely undisturbed quality of the trees lining its banks.

It is estimated that some of the older River Red Gums (E.camaldulensis) and Black Box (E.largiflorens) are 700 to 800 hundred years old. Make a point of inspecting the magnificent Yellow Gum (E.leucoxyon) on the west bank near the ski area that would be a least 500 years old. Many of the species of birds and the occasional wallaby can be seen along the creek. The best times for bird watching are in the early morning and evening.








Warracknabeal Town Map & Creek Walk









Historical Points of Interest

- Rowe's Flour Mill, est 1879 and later Stevens' Brewery.
- Wooden Flume Bridge carrying town drainage across the Creek to the Chinese Market Gardens.
- 5. Jamouneau Street Bridge, first vehicular bridge built in 1950. Present structure built in 1982.
- 6. Commercial Hotel c 1875.
- 7. Footbridge Lions Park.
- 8. Footbridge Asquith Avenue.
- 9. Lagoon Boardwalk.
- 10. Shag Island.
- 11. Monument.
- 12. Former weir site built to supply water to Warracknabeal Station. Washed away 1909 flood.
- 13. Weir c 1912. Rainbow Road Bridge.
- 14. Site of Woodbine Homestead c 1860 1939.
- 15. Lions Fauna Park.
- 16. Chinese Gardens, later War Service homes area.
- 17. Woodbine Boardwalk.
- 18. Woodbine School, Hostel and Administration.
- 19. Aboriginal Corroborree tree.
